## **David & June Gordon Memorial Trust**

The David Gordon Memorial Trust was formed in 1975 with the aim of providing funds for the continuation of the work started by the late 4th Marquess of Aberdeen and Temair, David Gordon. He, together with his wife June, had an abiding interest in music, the arts, charitable youth groups and in the continuation of ecumenical services in the chapel at Haddo House. Following the death of June Gordon in 2009 the Trust was renamed the David and June Gordon Memorial Trust.

The Trust provides small sums to applicants who are based in the North East of Scotland and who meet its aims, which are:

the advancement of music, drama and the arts;

the encouragement of charitable youth groups and community centres;

the promotion of Christian ecumenical services.
